Executive Summary

Becoming Ready, Becoming Real, When Potential Turned to Power

The second quarter at the Satsang Skill Development Centre (SSDC), Madanapalle, witnessed structured progress and meaningful milestones in student development.

Batch 13, which commenced on May 7, 2025, successfully completed its formal coursework and transitioned into the workforce readiness phase. Students are currently participating in interviews and placement activities, with some already starting their first jobs. This report captures their journey, marked not only by skill acquisition but also by growing confidence and independence.

This quarter also marked the beginning of Batch 14, which commenced training on September 19, 2025, embarking on a new cycle of learning. SSDC continues to focus on equipping participants with industry-relevant skills, fostering personal growth, and preparing them for successful professional integration.

Growing Through the Journey

Batch 13's journey was filled with learning and collaboration. Over the months, they became a close-knit group of 32. What made this experience unique was the individual counselling session – a core part of SSDC's approach, helping students work through inner blocks and believe in themselves. For many students, collaborating freely across genders was a new experience. They worked together on activities and responsibilities just as they would in a professional workplace, breaking social barriers and building teamwork skills. By the final phase, the change was unmistakable. They became ready for what's next.

A Visit That Reassured Every Parent

The Parents' Meeting at SSDC was not only a showcase of student growth but also a moment of reassurance for the families present. Kiran, an HR Manager from Indo-MIM, attended the event as a guest speaker, accompanied by his team. He introduced the company and highlighted that many SSDC alumni are already employed at Indo-MIM – a strong confirmation that the training and efforts of the students can lead to real, stable employment.

Kiran also shared his personal journey, speaking candidly about the challenges he faced and how he eventually built a successful career. His story resonated deeply with both students and parents.

"Every student who spoke today did so in English, and with confidence," he noted. "That shows they're ready."

For many families, this was the first time they heard directly from a company that actively hires SSDC graduates. The session not only made the possibility of employment tangible but also reinforced the trust and openness of the Centre. Even after completing training or joining jobs, families continue to engage with SSDC for career guidance, emotional support, and life updates – reflecting the lasting impact of the programme.



Salma: Quiet Strength in a Small Home

At just 18, Salma has faced life's challenges with remarkable focus and determination. After completing her 12th grade, she had to put further studies on hold – not by choice, but by necessity.

She helps care for her mother, who has lived with a seizure disorder for years, with monthly medication costs that strain the family's limited resources.

Her father works as a tomato seller in the local market, and her younger brother earns a living as an electrician. In their small rented home, every bit of income makes a difference.

Before joining SSDC, Salma had never used a computer or spoken a word of English. Yet, she showed up consistently, took initiative, and gradually found her voice.

Now, with her training completed and job interviews on the horizon, something has changed. The struggles remain, but alongside them has emerged a quiet, steadfast hope – the promise of a better tomorrow for herself and her family.



Mounika: Hope Woven Through Hardship

The day we visited Mounika's home was also a milestone for her – her first day at her first job.

We met her mother, a tailor, seated amidst piles of fabric, stitching quietly to support the family. Mounika's father is not part of their lives, and life has never been easy.

"Nobody in our family ever studied or completed school," her mother shared. "But Mounika has achieved something none of us could. I have struggled a lot... but today I feel proud."

Mounika is now the first educated person in her family and the first to gain employment. While her mother continues her work at home, the atmosphere in the room has transformed. Amid the threads and fabric, a new presence is felt: a quiet but powerful sense of pride – and hope for the future.
